Sign up is over but the trip has yet to begin! KC is headed to the Poconos this weekend. To those who are going, have fun and stay safe!

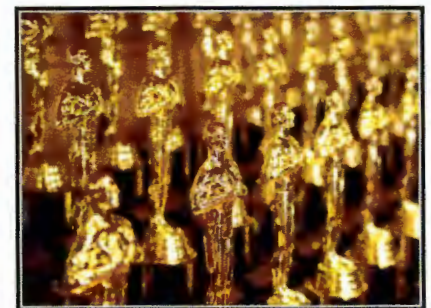


Rube Goldberg Signup Deadline (March 7th)
