If you have never been at Penn during Fling before (and have somehow yet to hear about it from others who have), then you have a lot to look forward (and some things to be wary of) this weekend.

This year's theme is "40 Years of Fling."

First, there are the concerts. There's the big one in Franklin Field. This year it will have artists Tyga, Girl Talk, and Janelle Monae.

There are also concerts that take place in the quad. This year's performers include Gigamesh, Autre Ne Veut, and Delorean. And dozens of Penn based groups will be performing as well including Counterparts, Disney A cappella, Bloomers Band, and the Glee Club Band.

The quad will also be host to a number of fun carnival-like games including an obstacle course, a bounce house, and something that looks like Twister.

And then there's the food. Lumpy's BBQ will provide Chili Cheese Fries, Fried Oreos (you have to have these!) and Chicken Fingers. Little Baby's Ice Cream will be offering nearly a dozen flavors of ice cream. Luke's will offer rolls of lobster, crab, and shrimp. Other vendors include Lil Pop Shop, Liberty Concessions, and Festival Food.
